 - Issue: Should we consider hiring CCDC for our development process?
 - Discussion: Many ideas, pro and con, mostly questions and concerns.

- Rona Fischman/Cambridge Nursing Home
 - Issue: Report from Micha Josephy on conversation with buyer's broker, Rona Fischman.
- Discussion: Rona Fischman has concerns about negotiating with sellers based on our financing model. We discussed ways to address those concerns. She also will get back to us on Thursday concerning the Cambridge Nursing Home property.
